

Sports Premium Funding

2013/14 Action Plan

Albert Bradbeer Primary School has been allocated £10,150 from the government for the 2013/14 academic year to improve the quality and breadth of sport provision within our school.

At Albert Bradbeer we aim to establish a sporting culture that enables and encourages all children to play and enjoy sport.

Please find detailed below how we have decided to spend this money to ensure that this funding has the greatest impact on improving the breadth and quality of P.E offered by our school.

Additional Swimming Lessons

The percentage of children able to swim 25 metres by the end of Y6 at Albert Bradbeer has historically fallen below the national average, so we have targeted this as our main area to focus our Sports Premium Funding.

- The Sports Premium will cover the costs of transport, pool hire & instruction to provide additional swimming lessons for those pupils unable to swim.

Affiliation with Warwickshire County Cricket Club

- Opportunity for continuous professional development (CPD) training for Y5 newly qualified teacher (NQT) to increase subject knowledge and confidence in delivering cricket lessons.
- Whole school assembly to promote the sport and cricket links within the community.
- High quality coaching sessions for all Y4 & Y6 pupils taught by a Warwickshire cricket coach.
- Entry into both Y4 & Y6 cricket festivals to play competitively against other schools in the local area.

Sports Plus Scheme

- Deliver a weekly after-school Multi-Skills club for all children from Y1-Y6 throughout the year.
- Provide weekly football training sessions for Y5/6 children playing competitively intra-school matches in preparation for matches & competitions against other schools in the local district.
- Organise & run additional holiday clubs for all children aged 4-11 to attend (at an additional cost).
- Providing whole school twilight training for all staff in an area of P.E that the audit shows up as being most needed.

- The qualified Sports Plus coach working alongside Teachers to increase subject knowledge and confidence in delivering P.E lessons.
- The children in years 1-6 identified as being Gifted & Talented in P.E take part in an additional weekly lesson where they receive intensive coaching and support.

CPD Training

- The school's P.E co-ordinator to attend two courses to enhance her knowledge of the new National Curriculum for P.E as well as to learn about opportunities for after-school activities within the local cluster of schools.

Cyber Coach

- Subscription fee for the online dance programme to support Teachers in the delivery of curriculum dance lessons.
- Cyber Coach is also used as a 'Wake up, Shake up' resource to ensure all children are taking part in physical activity each day.
- The subscription fee also entitles the children to access this resource at home hence encouraging healthy family lifestyles.

Football Affiliation fees for competitive sport events

- Entry fee to affiliate to Kings Norton football district to participate in local competitive matches and tournaments.
- Entry to fee to compete in the Birmingham-wide HMS Trophy competitive football competition.

Competitive KS2 Sports Day (to be held in July 2014)

- Set up costs including equipment, stickers, engraving of trophy etc.
